The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant Program provides up to \$4,000 per year in grants for graduate and undergraduate students who intend to teach full-time in high-need subject areas for at least four years at schools that serve students from low-income families.

#### TEACH Grant Checklist for Students

To receive Federal TEACH Grant funds during the \_\_\_\_\_ academic year, students must:

1. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) located at <https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa>.
2. Sign and submit this application to the Office of Financial Aid. (Keep a copy for your records.)
3. Complete the TEACH grant Agreement to Serve or Repay (Agreement) available electronically at <https://studentaid.gov/teach-grant-program>.
4. Have a cumulative college GPA of at least 3.25 or provide, to the financial aid office, documentation of having scored above the 75th percentile on a nationally normed admission test (i.e. ACT, SAT, GRE) along with this application.
5. Be enrolled in one of Alabama State University College of Education's approved TEACH Grant eligible programs.
6. Be a U.S. citizen, U.S. national, or permanent resident.
7. Not have defaulted on or owe a refund to any previous student aid program.
8. Be enrolled at least half-time each semester the award is received. Award will be prorated based on enrollment status.
9. Maintain satisfactory academic progress as defined by Alabama State University's Satisfactory Academic Progress requirements. These requirements are available on the ALASU website at <https://www.alasu.edu/cost-aid/policies-procedures/asu-satisfactory-academic-progress-requirements>.

By signing and submitting this application for the Federal TEACH Grant, I am establishing that I am enrolled in or plan to enroll in Alabama State University's College of Education approved TEACH Grant eligible program that will prepare me to teach in a high-need subject area.

It is my understanding to prevent my grant from becoming an unsubsidized loan, I must teach full-time, for at least four years, at schools that serve students from low-income families.
