

DR. LINDA J. M. HOLLOWAY Ed.D., NCC ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR PROGRAM COORDINATOR

Dr. Linda J.M. Holloway has been a faculty member at Alabama State University since 2018. She is an author, story activist, and spoken word artist. Dr. Holloway has served in the role of Program Coordinator for the master's programs in counseling from 2018, where she made several noteworthy contributions. Her areas of research include Black women and mental wellness, and career counseling for underserved and marginalized populations. In her spare time, Dr. Holloway enjoys spending time with family, friends, catching a good movie, and doing absolutely nothing.

the term "story activist" arose, and she shared with me that it was a term that she coined. It is a term meant to amplify the diminished voices of marginalized individuals and reach the community through storybook activism and outreach. The way Dr. Holloway chooses to reach others is through stories she writes. As an accomplished author, she has published eight awardwinning children's books, and many of them have been as a means of activism and her two campaigns. One of her campaigns, the Anti-Bully Hair campaign, centers around her book I Love My Happy Hair. It is intentionally purposed to both combat the bullying and negative narratives surrounding Black hair and teach kids to love their hair! Behind this mission of empowerment is the fight against low childhood literacy rates. Dr. Holloway is a firm believer that along with literacy with books, children should be socially and emotionally literate as well. It is important to her that children be able to express themselves. This belief is the reason why Dr. Holloway has two new books on death and divorce titled Little Miss Linda Copes with Divorce and Little Miss Linda Speaks out About Death. They may not be able to talk about their own lived experiences, but they may be able to talk about a character with an experience similar to theirs. By identifying themselves within a book, children are able to gain language and tools to communicate their emotions.

As a story activist, she is not just concerned about the literacy of children in her community. She is also mindful of children around the world! As apart of her campaign, Books Without Borders, Dr. Holloway has gifted hundreds of copies of her books to children across seas including the country of South Africa! Dr. Holloway grew up with her own books and fell in love with reading as a young child. So, she values children having at least one book as their own to feel, read, and keep. Her sentiments are rooted in the fact that there is a digital divide. Some children do not have access to a library or even the internet. Thus, it is a pleasure of hers to donate her books to children overseas on an annual basis. There is so much to be shared about Dr. Holloway from her Classroom Without Walls teaching philosophy, to her Riverboat Curriculum Study Guide and bibliotherapy counseling approach. Even with all of her accomplishments, there is still so much on the horizon for her! Thank you Dr. Holloway for all that you do for our counseling programs, community, and the world at large!


