Consent is a voluntary agreement to engage in sexual activity. Consent must be informed, voluntary, and mutual, and can be withdrawn at any time.

Sexual assault is actual or attempted sexual contact with another person without that person's consent.

pattern of abusive behavior in any relationship that is used by one partner to gain or maintain power and control over another intimate partner. The pattern of abusive violent behaviors involves a current or former spouse or domestic partner.

Dating Violence is defined as the physical, sexual, psychological, or emotional violence within a dating relationship. Dating violence is committed by a person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature.

Stalking is a pattern of repeated and unwanted attention, harassment, contact, or any other course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to feel fear.
