## **Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriation Act, 2021(CRRSAA) Act**

### **Reporting requirements**

Recipient must promptly and timely report to the Department on the use of funds no later than 6 months after the date of this award in a manner to be specified by the Secretary pursuant to section 314€ of the CRRSAA. Recipient must also promptly and timely provide a detailed accounting of the use of funds provided by this award in such manner and with such subsequent frequency as the Secretary may require. Recipient will comply with any other applicable reporting requirements including those included in the Notice of Public Posting Requirement of Grant Information for HEERF Grantees.

1. Report to the Secretary no later than sixty (60) days from the date of the award which was awarded on December 27, 2020. On May 13, 2021, the Department of Education issued a notice which revised the initial reporting date. The Department encourages institutions to report as soon as possible, but no later than 30 days after the publication of this notice of 30 days after the date the Department first obligated under HEERF I, II, or III to the institution for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students, whichever comes later.
2. How the grants were distributed to the students.

The University determined that the distribution of grants would occur in a manner similar to the distribution method used in the initial CARES Act Distribution.

A student who has demonstrated eligibility to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended (HEA), by filing a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for academic year 2020-2021 is eligible to receive an emergency financial aid grant from ASU. Students who did not file a FAFSA are also eligible to receive an emergency financial aid grant from ASU if you are U.S. citizenship or eligible noncitizen; have a valid Social Security number; registered with

Selective Service (if the student is male); and have obtained a high school diploma, GED, or completed a high school in an approved homeschool setting.

The University determined student eligibility by the criteria identified above and as follows:

- Students enrolled in classes as of February 26, 2021 with a FAFSA on file.
- Students enrolled in classes as of February 26, 2021 who have not filed a FAFSA if they meet the following criteria:
  - US citizen or eligible noncitizen
  - A valid social security number
  - Registration with selective service (if male)
  - High School Diploma, GED, or completion of high school in an approved homeschool setting
  - Enrolled in and attended “for credit classes”
  - Enrolled at ASU on February 26, 2021

Students who were enrolled in classes as of February 26, 2021 and had not filed a FAFSA completed their certification by submitting the form titled “ASU CRRSAA Program for Students that did not file a FAFSA”

As of June 30, 2021, there has not been any additional disbursements then what was provided in the initial report, however there was a typo in the initial report. The initial report indicated that \$3,008,934.75 had been disbursed to students however that amount is \$3,142,934.25. 3,253 students were deemed eligible in the initial population.  $\$3,142,232$  divided by 3,253 students which yielded \$965.95 is the calculation that was used to determine the payment that would be distributed to the eligible population. As of June 22, 2021, the eligible population includes students who were enrolled in classes as of February 26, 2021 with a FAFSA on file as well as students who completed the “ASU Cares Program for Students that did not file a FAFSA” certifying the items above were 3,115 students. \$3,008,934.25 have currently been disbursed to students.

The University has continued to pay its employees as well as the contractors during this period.

The University will comply with all of the requirements listed in Attachment A of the Recipient’s Certification and Agreement (Gold C&A) under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplement Appropriation Act 2021.
