Today, ASU has nine major units: University College, College of Arts and Sciences, college of Health Sciences, College of Business Administration, college of Education, the School of Music, the School of Graduate Studies, Continuing Education and the Division of Aerospace Studies. The academic offerings range from the baccalaureate to the education specialist degree. The physical plant is approximately 156.4 acres and is valued at more than \$150 million. The faculty has grown from three to over 300. The university has conferred some 98 associate degrees, 27,080 baccalaureate degrees and 7,973 graduate degrees through 2003. Since Alabama State University’s founding, more than 42,263 persons have earned degrees (includes high school diplomas and certificates from the university. Dr. Joe A. Lee serves as president, having begun his tenure September 2001.
